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Goals of MA Medical Home Project

- Identify and support Primary Care Partners committed to:
 - delivering care which is accessible, family-centered, continuous, comprehensive, coordinated, compassionate, culturally effective
 - addressing system-of-care issues
 - quality improvement
- If Medical Home can't work for providers, Medical Home can't work for families

Starting Point: Parents' Experience of Care



- Fragmented & compartmentalized
- Overly "medical"
- Inefficient, expensive, full of hidden costs
- Confusing,
 demoralizing, and
 corrosive to family

1990s Approach

- Regional Health Office based
- Resource-focused "case management"
 - Limited focus on systems issues
 - Thin connections to Primary Care
- Luckier families found us
- Limited numbers served

2000+ Approach:

- Reach out to broader audience
- Build alliances with primary care providers
- Explore systems and quality issues
- Improve data gathering capacity
- Bring family concerns to the fore


Which pediatric practice most needs care coordination?

- Family input is
 - Invited and accepted
 - Actively sought
 - Organized and effective
- Parents are allies, not adversaries



PBCC--an evolving model

- Generalist CCs
- Backgrounds
 - Social Work
 - Case Management
 - Public Benefits &
 Resource expertise
- Tasks primarily social, not medical

- Team synergy
- Core CSHCN v. at-risk clientele
- Systematize workflow and documentation
- Encounter-based data gathering


Families served

- First half FY02: 733
- First half FY03: 1154
- Age birth-22 years, but 25% between 3-5 years
- By disability category:
 - Neurological (25%)
 - Congenital Anomalies & Conditions of the Newborn Period (24%)
 - Learning, Cognition and Development disorders (14%)
- 86% have a Primary Care Provider
- 52% privately insured; 41% Medicaid

Top 3 Services to Families

- Assistance with financing medical services
 (28%)
- Flexible Family Support funding (15%)
- Education (8%)
